
Registrations will take place at 11.30, a light lunch will be available during the meeting

A European survey has shown that more than a third of cancer patients in Europe use complementary and alternative medicine (CAM), to increase their body's ability to fight the disease, to enhance their health and well-being, to feel empowered, and to alleviate physical and/or psychological distress. Emerging evidence from clinical trials suggests that several CAM therapies may address pain, fatigue, and psychological distress and improve quality of life in cancer patients.

Because of the growing interest in CAM by patients, academic cancer centres are exploring ways to integrate such care into a conventional cancer treatment system. Speakers from two universities with a thorough expertise in both conventional and CAM approaches in the treatment of cancer patients have been invited to make presentations outlining the role of CAM in prevention and treatment, and the benefits of integrating both approaches. A representative from the Norwegian Cancer Society and cancer league will also make a presentation on how they work with cancer patients and CAM.
